Back in the day this flock of nearly 30 of our woolly friends would probably have bought a five-figure sum, but this example is modestly estimated at £3,000-5,000. We will also



be selling a collection of Lalique glass which will be complimented by a number of pieces from the American studio of Vandermark Merritt.



As ever, there is an extensive collection of porcelain from the local Worcester factory, extending to nearly 150 lots with estimates and styles to suit all tastes. A personal favourite is a small green ewer beautifully painted with a Corot scene by Harry Davis. And whilst we are on the subject of personal favourites, a table globe by Cary dated 1832 would grace any room.



On the book front, the paperback edition of Philip’s latest book “What am I Bid” will be released on April 26<sup>th</sup>, with various book tours and talks in a number of locations taking place over the next few months.
